▶ PROPELLER

WHAT IS IT? In its second year - Propeller is a dance training programme for young people across Cornwall. Taught by highly trained, professional dancers and choreographers, it's for 11-16 year olds interested in a career in dance.

At one of 6 groups, over 30 evening sessions, you will get intensive training from tutors, opportunities to see and participate in performances, earn accreditation points towards A-level (or equivalent) courses at Cornwall College and Falmouth University. Propeller members are given practical support and encouragement should they wish to be involved in national opportunities such as National Youth Dance Company. At 16- should you wish- you would be offered a place on the new Foundation Diploma course 'Altitude'. Accredited by Cornwall College and Falmouth University.

WHERE AND WHEN IS IT? Where and when is it? There are six Propeller groups across Cornwall that meet once a week in term time — that's 30 sessions over 3 terms per year.

HOW DO I JOIN? You are invited to join a fun and friendly workshop in your preferred location over the week of 22nd of May. These 'try out' workshops will take place during a regular Propeller session so you will be dancing with the existing Propeller young people. The group will be observed discreetly and an offer will be made by email to successful candidates.

▶ ALTITUDE

WHAT IS IT? Altitude is a brand new two-year diploma in dance for aspiring professional dancers available to dance students 16 years plus. It is delivered by Cornwall College in partnership with Falmouth University and DR2, focusing on contemporary dance, offering participants the chance to develop skills that will carry them through to professional-level training. Successful completion of the course will mean a guaranteed place on the BA Hons Dance & Choreography course at Falmouth University.

Altitude gives students the chance to explore their full physical and creative capabilities through regular contemporary technique, ballet, choreography, and improvisation classes/workshops. In addition to the practical elements of the course, students will also learn about the political and social contexts that shape current dance practice, and research new and emerging dance-works. To develop their performance skills, students participate in projects that range from small studio based 'sharings' to large, site-specific events, in collaboration with DR2 and the Propeller dance training programme.

Past alumni of Cornwall College dance programmes include James Wilton, Joss Arnot, Jake Moyle, Lee Griffiths and Laura Henry.

WHERE AND WHEN IS IT? Altitude is primarily based in St Austell with some elements delivered at the Academy of Music and Theatre Arts, Falmouth University.

Candidates will need 4 GCSEs including English or Maths at Grade C or 5 and successful completion of an audition/interview.
